
Current Residence Proposed Renovation



Rebuilding this residence hall allows the team to have total creativity in proposing a new building. This design allows better curb appeal, a new and modern addition that still reflects parts of campus.












Jacks In Style Retail




Jacks In Style Pop Up Shop

COVID-19 Classroom Redesign






Due to fixed seating, there were limited social distancing arrangements. The chart below explains how many students the room could hold currently compared to when social distance is applied.

The university needed to know the number of students plus the number of Student Aide (S.A) and Faculty. In order to show this, we used colors to easily differentiate the students from staff.




Social Distance Floor Plan










The Parker Condominium
